
Probably the most noticeable difference this year was the freer atmosphere, the not-so-concentrated program for the week.

However, I personally felt there could have been more use made of our guest speaker. ~LL






For "Sabbath School" Michael handed out postcards for people to write out questions for specific persons or comments.

QUESTION: Was it worth the cost for you?



ANSWER: I wouldn't miss it! ~ TH


